Curriculum Aims

The purpose of our curriculum is to:

Curriculum Approach

- Learning reviewed daily (retrieval practice);
- New content taught in small chunks;
- Effective teacher questioning;
- Lots of teacher modelling;
- Regular opportunities for children to think, apply and practise key skills and knowledge;
- Support for difficult tasks;
- Develop long term memory, whilst respecting the limitations of the working memory.

Writing

Children will learn to:

Number – addition and subtraction

- add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally, including: a two-digit number and ones
- count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward
- add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally, including: a two-digit number and tens
- solve problems with addition and subtraction: using concrete objects and pictorial representations, including those involving numbers, quantities and measures

Geometry – properties of shape

- compare and sort common 2D and 3D shapes and everyday objects.
- identify and describe the properties of 2D shapes, including the number of sides and line symmetry in a vertical line
- compare and sort common 2-D and 3-D shapes and everyday objects
- order and arrange combinations of mathematical objects in patterns and sequences
- identify and describe the properties of 3D shapes, including the number of edges, vertices and faces.
