stem The long, thin part of a plant that holds it up.

Volume is measured in decibels.

- High Pitch – A whistle blowing
- Low Pitch – A lorry engine rumbling

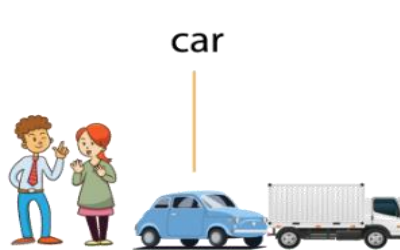

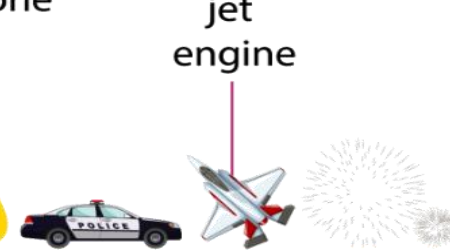
