- Regular opportunities for children to think, apply and practise key skills and knowledge;
- Support for difficult tasks;
- Develop long term memory, whilst respecting the limitations of the working memory.

#### Plants

Children will learn:

- How do I plant a bean?
- What type of plants grow in the wild?
- What is the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees?
- What are the parts of trees and plants called?
- What changed occur to a tomato plant?
- What changes occur to a bean plant?

# Main Learning Focus in Religious Education:

#### Who is Jewish and what do they believe?

Children will learn about the religion of Judaism and find out about what is important to Jewish people.

# Main Learning Focus in Physical Education:

Children will focus on developing Outdoor activities in Forest School and multi-skills in PE.

# Main Learning Focus in Learning for Life:

Growing and changing

# Main learning Focus in Art:

Woven Wonders – Children will use creative techniques like wool wrapping and weaving, and understand the work of artists like Cecilia Vicuña.

# Main learning focus in Geography:

At the Farm- Children will find out about arable, livestock and dairy farms and the difference between them. They will also learn about the features of a farm and use a map to navigate around a farm, as well as thinking about the differences between life in the country and life in a busy town.
