Curriculum Aims

The purpose of our curriculum is to:

- enable children to become confident, resourceful, enquiring and independent learners;
- foster children's self-esteem and help them build positive relationships with other people;
- develop children's self-respect and encourage children to respect the ideas, attitudes, values and feelings of others:
- show respect for all cultures and, in so doing, to promote positive attitudes towards other people;
- enable children to understand their community and help them feel valued as part of this community;
- help children grow into reliable, independent and positive citizens for the 21st century.

Curriculum Approach

- Learning reviewed daily (retrieval practice);
- · New content taught in small chunks;
- Effective teacher questioning;
- Lots of teacher modelling;
- Regular opportunities for children to think, apply and practise key skills and knowledge;
- Support for difficult tasks;
- Develop long term memory, whilst respecting the limitations of the working memory.

Writing

- I can plan my writing by writing down my ideas or talking about them.
- I can write the correct spelling and punctuation in simple sentences I hear my teacher say.
- I can use capital letters and full stops to show where sentences start and end and sometimes use question marks.
- I can tell if a sentence is a question, command, exclamation or a statement.
- I can use description in my writing e.g the blue butterfly, plain flour, the man in the moon.

Grammar and Punctuation

- Use co-ordination (using or, and, but) and some subordination (using when, if, that, because) to join clauses.
- Use the progressive form of verbs in the present and past tense to make actions in progress e.g. she is drumming, he was shouting.
- Use present and past tense mostly correctly.

Spelling

- I can spell some words which have been shortened.
- Common exception words

Handwriting

- Form lower-case letters of the correct size relative to one another using tails and flicks.
- Write capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another and to lower case letters.

- identify and describe the properties of 2D shapes, including the number of sides and line symmetry in a vertical line
- compare and sort common 2-D and 3-D shapes and everyday objects

- identify and describe the properties of 3D shapes, including the number of edges, vertices

and faces.
